

The lake level is very low this year so we must be diligent about looking after our propellers on the whalers. Please remember to put the motor up to harbour tilt when leaving and approaching the pier. It's also a good idea to take a look at the prop before you leave and after you return. A prop with even a small ding in it can cause damage to the motor if it is driven at high speeds.
